The leadership of Harbor Life is regularly meeting to discuss the best way to adapt to the ever changing world we are living in right now. We are constantly in prayer for wisdom and discernment on how to gather safely and provide online content that continually helps people find their way to God. We thank you for your patience, grace, and prayer as we do our best to sense where God is leading.

We are holding one service at 10am on Sunday mornings with masks mandatory. We realize that there are differing opinions on masks. So, if you're interested in how we came to our decision, there is a detailed description of our rationale in this video <https://vimeo.com/438754537>.

When you arrive it will look and feel a little different. We are asking that everyone enter the church through the large front doors facing Wallace. When you enter the building, we will have ushers help you to facilitate immediate seating. Every other row will be closed and we will be seating one family on each end of a pew. Please refrain from gathering in the area right outside the sanctuary. When the service is over, please exit the building through the front doors you entered through. Please do not gather in the sanctuary; instead gather outside in front of the church, in the grassy areas or in the parking lot.

We are also excited to announce that we will have a modified Harbor Kids program. This too will look and feel different than normal. Kids age 3yrs to entering 2nd grade will be gathering back in the garage area for a lesson, activities, and games. Parents, please bring your children to the "Harbor Kids" flag before going into the church building. Check-in will look normal with the addition of a participation waiver. All volunteers will be required to wear masks during programming, and children are strongly encouraged to wear masks. We will have pre-bagged craft supplies and frequently sanitize any shared items. At the end of the service, children may be picked at the large front doors facing Wallace. Check out our social media pages for more information.

As excited as we are to gather, the chapel is ready as well. It is extremely important that we do everything we can to make sure we keep the chapel safe. Many of those who attend the chapel are the most vulnerable to Covid-19. For that reason, we are asking that no one except chapel members use the west side of the building. Thank you for caring for our partners in ministry who worship in the chapel.
